get in touch with us, and we'll try to find out the info you need. Other shows will continue to be added to the summer line-up.

You may be wondering about proposed changes to the Horse Protection Act. The simplest way to explain it, is that there has been a delay until 2026. The same process for inspecting horses will continue as it was in 2024 using the DQP system. So we will proceed as usual.

Plans are being made for the RMHA International. Last year, an amateur western class was added. Ann is planning to show in it as well as Julie B. This year there will be an amateur conformation class in addition to the age division conformation classes. There has been discussion about breaking up the conformation classes and having some each morning of the show instead of having them all on Wednesday morning. Also There has been a 4-5 yo championship added for Country Trail, Trail and Show Pleasure horses. These championships will give more opportunity for young horses to be recognized. As I understand it, these classes will not be qualifying classes for the Grand Championship. Leah has already started looking at T shirt designs and we've been looking at how to incorporate the theme "Riding the Rhythm Around the World" into SRF's decorations. It will be a great time for sure.

In anticipation of the shows, please send me a copy of your membership card. I have coggins and health certificates for the horses. I'll be filling out preentry forms so we'll be ready. Like last year, if you can bring a check to pay for entry fees at the shows, that would be great. If you aren't able to make it in person, we'll add those costs to your invoice. Again, we are looking forward to some great times this summer.
